SUMMARY OF INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 676

Mechanical and Electrical Equipment Ordinance Amendment

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE 5.0 SITE STANDARDS IN CHAPTER 42, ZONING, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD FOR GROUND AND WALL MOUNTED MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT.

The purpose of Proposed Ordinance 676 is to consider adding ground or wall mechanical or electrical equipment as site conditions and not subject to accessory use provisions.

At a meeting on Monday, April 24, 2023, 7:00 p.m., the Bloomfield Township Board of Trustees will consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 676. The meeting will take place in the Bloomfield Township Hall Auditorium, 4200 Telegraph Road, Bloomfield Hills, MI 48302.

ORDINANCE NO. 676

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE 5.0 SITE STANDARDS IN CHAPTER 42, ZONING, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD FOR GROUND AND WALL MOUNTED MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD ORDAINS:

Section 1.

Article 5, Site Standards, Section 42-5.1 Accessory Structures, is hereby amended as follows:

42 – 5.1 ACCESSORY STRUCTURES

The regulations in this Chapter shall be subject to the following interpretations and exceptions:

- 1. through 6. [no change].
- 7. Ground mounted mechanical or electrical equipment shall be considered an accessory structure and may be placed on the site or lot as noted below. For purposes of this Section, the terms "ground mounted mechanical" or "electrical equipment" means air conditioner units, generators or pool equipment.

A. One-family residential districts.

- i. Ground mounted mechanical or electrical equipment shall be permitted in any rear yard when placed immediately adjacent to the residential building. Said equipment may be permitted in any side yard or secondary frontage subject to all of the following:
 - a. The equipment shall be placed immediately adjacent to the residential building.
 - b. The equipment shall be located outside the required sixteen (16) front side yard setback or required front yard setback as measured from the lot line.

- c. Said equipment in side or secondary front yards shall be screened from view by a screen wall consisting of materials identical to those used on the main building or, through the use of evergreen plant material at least the height of the equipment and located at the point of placement of the equipment.
- d. Screen walls, other than vegetative screen walls, shall be located outside the required sixteen (16) foot setback or the required front yard setback as measured from the lot line.
- ii. Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screenwalls shall be maintained in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant materials shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.
- B. One-family cluster and multiple-family residential districts.
 - i. Ground mounter mechanical or electrical equipment shall be permitted in any rear yard or secondary frontage when placed immediately adjacent to the residential building.
 - ii. Ground mounted mechanical or electrical equipment shall be screened from an adjacent public or private street. Said equipment shall be obscured from view by a screen wall consisting of materials identical to those used on the main building they are to serve, or through the use of evergreen plant material at least height of the equipment screen wall and located at the point of placement. The screen wall shall screen the equipment at a height not less than the height of the equipment. Screen walls, other than vegetative screen walls, shall be located outside the required side yard setback as measured from the side lot line.
 - iii. Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screen walls shall be maintained in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant maternal shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.
- C. Nonresidential districts. Air conditioners shall in all instances be placed in a rear yard when side yards are less than twenty (20) feet in width. When placed inside yards of greater than twenty (20) feet in width they shall be placed immediately adjacent to the unit intended to be served. They shall be screened from view through the use of materials identical to those used in the main building at the point of placement of the air conditioner. When placed on the roof of the structure they shall be fully obscured from view meeting all the requirements of height, bulk, setback and materials as set forth in Sections 42-3.10.10.

Section 2.

Article 5, Site Standards, Section 42-5.17 Ground Mounted Mechanicals, is hereby added with the illustrations as follows:

42-5.17 Ground Mounted Mechanicals

Ground mounted mechanical equipment may be placed on the site or lot as noted below. The terms "ground mounted mechanical equipment" means air conditioner units, generators, transformers, pool equipment or other related equipment. For purposes of this Section, ground mounted mechanicals shall not be considered an accessory use nor be subject to Section 42-5.1 Accessory Structures.

- One-family residential districts. Ground mounted mechanical equipment shall be permitted in a rear yard when placed immediately adjacent to the residential building. Said equipment may be permitted in any side yard or secondary frontage subject to all of the following:
 - A. For placement of said equipment in a side yard:
 - i. The equipment shall be placed immediately adjacent to the residential building.
 - ii. The equipment may project up to six (6) feet into the required sixteen (16) foot side yard setback as measured from the residential building.
 - iii. Said equipment in side yards shall be screened from view through the use of evergreen plant material at least the height of the unit at the point of placement of the equipment, or by a screen wall consisting of materials compatible with those used on the main building and shall be no closer than ten (10) feet to the side lot line.
 - B. For placement of said equipment in a secondary frontage:
 - i. The equipment shall be placed immediately adjacent to the residential building.
 - ii. <u>The equipment may project ten (10) feet into the required secondary front yard</u> <u>setback as measured from the residential building.</u>
 - iii. Said equipment in secondary front yards shall be screened from public view through the use of evergreen plant material at least the height of the unit at the point of placement of the equipment, or by a screen wall consisting of materials

compatible with those used on the main building and shall be no more than ten (10) feet as measured from the residential building.

- C. <u>Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screen walls shall be maintained</u> in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant materials shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.
- One-family cluster, planned unit developments and multiple-family residential districts.
 a. Ground mounted mechanical equipment shall be permitted in any side yard, rear
 - yard or secondary frontage when placed immediately adjacent to the residential building.
 - b. <u>Ground mounted mechanical equipment shall be screened from an adjacent public or private street. Said equipment shall be obscured from public view through the use of evergreen plant material at least height of the equipment and located at the point of placement, or by a screen wall at least the height of the equipment and consisting of materials compatible with those used on the main building they are to serve.</u>
 - c. Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screen walls shall be maintained in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant materials shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.

- 3. <u>Nonresidential districts.</u> Ground mounted mechanical equipment shall be located immediately adjacent to the main building intended to be served and in all instances be placed in a rear yard when side yards are less than twenty (20) feet in width. When placed in side yards of greater than twenty (20) feet in width, they shall be placed immediately adjacent to the building intended to be served. They shall be screened from view through the use of materials identical to those used in the building at least the height of the equipment and at the point of placement of the equipment, or obscured from public view by evergreen plant material at least the height of the equipment and located at the point of placement.
- 4. When placed on the roof of the structure, they shall be fully obscured from public view meeting all the requirements of height, bulk, setback and materials as set forth in Sections 42-3.10.10.
- 5. <u>Ground mounted mechanical equipment shall comply with the decibel requirements</u> of not exceeding seventy (70) dB(a) in compliance with Chapter 14 Environment, <u>Sections 14-22 and 14-23</u>

Section 3.

Article 5, Site Standards, Section 42-5.18 Wall Mounted Mechanicals, is hereby added as follows:

42-5.18 Wall Mounted Mechanicals

Wall mounted mechanical equipment may be placed on the site or lot as noted below. The terms "wall mounted mechanical equipment" means air conditioner units, generators, transformers, pool equipment or other related equipment. For purposes of this Section, wall mounted mechanical equipment shall not be considered an accessory use nor be subject to Section 42-5.1 Accessory Structures.

- <u>One-family residential districts including one family cluster, planned unit</u> <u>developments, and multiple family residential districts. When mounted on the wall,</u> <u>mechanical equipment may be placed on the side, rear or secondary frontage wall of</u> <u>the residence and shall be fully obscured from public view through the use of</u> <u>evergreen plant material at least the height of the equipment and located at the point</u> <u>of placement.</u>
 - A. Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screen walls shall be maintained in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant materials shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.
- 2. Nonresidential districts. When mounted on the wall, mechanical equipment may be placed on the rear wall of the building and shall be fully obscured from public view through the use of evergreen plant material at least the height of the equipment and located at the point of placement.
 - A. Evergreen plant material utilized in vegetative screen walls shall be maintained in a healthy condition. Dead or diseased plant materials shall be replaced with healthy materials of like size and kind.
- 3. <u>Wall mounted mechanical equipment shall comply with the decibel requirements of not</u> <u>exceeding seventy (70) dB(a) in compliance with Chapter 14 Environment, Sections</u> <u>14-22 and 14-23.</u>

Section 4. Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

Section 5. Severability.

If any section, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared to be unconstitutional, void, illegal or ineffective by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such section, clause or provision declared to be unconstitutional, void or illegal shall thereby cease to be a part of this Ordinance, but the remainder of this Ordinance shall stand and be in full force and effect.

Section 6. Savings.

All proceedings pending and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred at the time this Ordinance takes effect are saved and may be consummated according to the law when they were commenced.

Section 7. Effective Date.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.

Section 8. Adoption.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Bloomfield at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the _____ day of _____, 2023, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by the Charter Township of Bloomfield.
