


### **Permit Services**

Permit services involves all permit activities from when an application is submitted until a permit is issued. The functions include screening applications/plans, and routing plans to building, mechanical, plumbing, electrical, fire and engineering staff for review. Permit services also assess and collect fees for all permits and change of occupancy applications.






• In 2017, the Building Division issued complete residential 36 <u>demolition</u> building permits, with a monthly average of 3.





• In 2017, the Building Division issued 70 <u>new</u> residential building permits, with a monthly average of 6.





Number of Addition/Alteration Residential Building Permits






#### **Comparison Charts**

• In 2017, the Building Division issued 886 **plumbing** permits, with a monthly average of 74.




• In 2017, the Building Division issued 1700 <u>electrical</u> permits, with a monthly average of 142.

• In 2017, the Building Division issued 1466 <u>mechanical</u> permits, with a monthly average of 122.





The Building Plan Reviewers provide technically proficient plan review of proposed construction plans and documents to verify conformance with structural and nonstructural code requirements. Theses projects can include new buildings, alterations, additions, and repairs to existing buildings. The building plan reviewers conduct reviews in a timely, consistent, transparent, professional and courteous manner for each application. When necessary, preconstruction meetings are conducted for code interpretations and to resolve major code issues on larger projects prior to issuance of the permit.



• For the seventh year, the Building Division along with the Planning and Ordinance Divisions participated in the 2017 Annual Fall Township Open House.










#### Minor Home Repair Program

- Bloomfield Township Senior Services facilitates the Minor Home Repair program with funding from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. The Building Division supports the Bloomfield Township Senior Services in their administration of this program.
- In 2017, Nine Bloomfield Township homeowners were approved for assistance in their home repairs. Some of the repairs included:
  - Repair/replace ceiling, wall/tile, stair carpet, front door, secure window in garage, porch pillars, built in oven, molding, leak, sidewalk, chimney and electrical repairs.
  - Replacement of faucet, kitchen floor, humidifier, toilets, siding, garage door, closet door, light, garage door openers, windows, closet doors, furnace, entry door, sinks in bathrooms & gutters
  - Seal driveway, remove trees, clean septic tank, clean roof & install grab bars.

#### **Building Industry Association Meeting**

• The Building Industry Association (BIA) of Southeastern Michigan has sponsored builder and community task force meetings at the Township for approximately 20 years. In 2017, the Building Division hosted task force meetings on April 13<sup>th</sup> and October 12<sup>th</sup>. The meetings provide an opportunity for builders to meet with the inspectors and staff in a friendly and informative forum. The discussion included pertinent topics such as the following: increased activity of new residential construction permits, upcoming code changes, monitoring of properties, road repairs and Township hours for working on construction sites for ordinance compliance. Representatives from area banks provided. A lending report and a utility update from DTE Energy was presented. In the fall, the BIA and the Township discussed the same as above and addressed the new commercial and residential projects under way: such as Barron Estates, Legacy Hills, Nino's, Equinox Fitness Club and the Villages of Bloomfield.



#### **Safety Committee**

• Appointed by the PBO Director, Lead Ordinance Officer Brenda Schlutow joined Building Official George Kilpatrick and Development Coordinator Planner Andrea Bibby to form the Department's first Safety Committee. The purpose of the committee is to raise employee awareness of potential dangers or hazards in the workplace. Training seminars as well as hands-on training and online exercises are scheduled to ensure that staff is provided with proper instruction when faced with an emergency. Planning, Building and Ordinance Division staff took part in an online assessment for defensive driving safety, were taught proper use of a fire extinguisher by a Township firefighter and completed an online course regarding how to avoid back injuries.





#### Online inspections

• The website allows homeowners and contractors to search for permit records, review completed inspections, and permit holders can schedule and cancel inspections. The Building Division can create a new account for permit holders at the time of permit application or license registration. Alternatively, permits holders can create an account and link to Bloomfield Township records at <a href="https://www.accessmygov.com">www.accessmygov.com</a> with a unique PIN number the Township can provide.
