


Permit Services

Permit services involves all permit activities from when an application is submitted until a permit is issued. The functions include screening applications/plans, and routing plans to building, mechanical, plumbing, electrical, fire and engineering staff for review. Permit services also assess and collect fees for all permits and change of occupancy applications.





• In 2015, the Building Division issued 25 complete residential <u>demolition</u> building permits, with a monthly average of 2.




• In 2015, the Building Division issued 55 <u>new</u> residential building permits, with a monthly average of 5.

• In 2015, the Building Division issued **884** <u>addition/alteration</u> Residential building permits, with a monthly average of **74**.






(Above picture: Second Floor Addition with façade renovation)

Subcontractors are individuals, or in many cases a business, that sign a contract to perform part or all of the obligations of another's contract. A subcontractor is generally hired by the general or building contractor. These contractors include Plumbing, Mechanical and Electrical trades.

• In 2015, the Building Division issued **815** plumbing permits, with a monthly average of **68**.







(Above picture: Installation of a shower pan)

Subcontractor Permits Comparison Charts


• In 2015, the Building Division issued 1,458 <u>mechanical</u> permits, with a monthly average of 122.

Plan Reviewers Comparison Charts

The Building Plan Reviewers provide technically proficient plan review of proposed construction plans and documents to verify conformance with structural and non-structural code requirements. Theses projects can include new buildings, alterations, additions, and repairs to existing buildings. The building plan reviewers conduct reviews in a timely, consistent, transparent, professional and courteous manner for each application. When necessary, pre-construction meetings are conducted for code interpretations and to resolve major code issues on larger projects prior to issuance of the permit.






Sylvan Lake Inspections Comparison Charts

Accomplishments Minor Home Repair Program

Bloomfield Township Senior Services facilitates the Minor Home Repair program with funding from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. The Building Division supports the Bloomfield Township Senior Services in their administration of this program.

In 2015, thirteen Bloomfield Township homeowners were approved for assistance in their home repairs. Some of the repairs included:

- Repair/replace well pump, boiler, crank opener on bay window, gas-line, block glass for basement windows, exterior brick, water tank, dryer vents, water line, downspouts, sidewalks, deck, porch steps, kitchen leak, and counter top.
- · Replacement of a toilet, kitchen floor, counter tops, screens, side garage door, back door, sewer line in basement, patio/porch light, garbage disposal, windows, closet doors, heaters, storm door, sinks in bathrooms & gutters
- · Adding smoke detectors, carbon-monoxide detectors, insulation, grab bars, ground outlets in kitchen & bathrooms,
- Seal driveway, trim trees, clean septic tank, clean furnace & replace filter



Accomplishments Building Industry Association Meeting



The Building Industry Association (BIA) of Southeastern Michigan has sponsored builder and community task force meetings at the Township for approximately 18 years. In 2015, the Building Division hosted task force meetings on April 23rd and October 22. The meetings provide an opportunity for builders to meet with the inspectors and staff in a friendly and informative forum. The discussion included pertinent topics such as the following:

- Building permit activity: Residential activity was on par with 2014 and Commercial was actively higher in 2015.
- New Projects: BMW Dealership, 1st and Main Senior Development, Office/Retail Building including Beau's and Starbucks, Jimmy John's stand-alone restaurant, and new retail development including Starbucks, Potbelly and Chipolte.
- Spring time: Builders were reminded to continue to focus on keeping sites and roads clean
- Informed the members that the former Bloomfield Park was purchased by Redico who has concept plans under way
- Identified that the 2015 MRC (Michigan Residential Code) would be adopted in February of 2016.
- The State giving over permits and inspections for stairlifts to City and Townships.
- Announced that Bloomfield Township implemented the ability to schedule and view inspections online with the new AccessMyGov.com website.
- Discussion on the changes in the energy code of the 2015 Residential Code to be implemented in 2016.

From BIA to forum:

Received reports from the Bank representatives that lending is at an all-time high with low interest rates.


Received reports from DTE Utility Company explaining the installation process.

Permit forecast for single family homes remains strong for 2015 into 2016.

Accomplishments Online inspections

Earlier this year, Bloomfield Township launched our new online inspection process. The website allows homeowners and contractors to search for permit records, review completed inspections, and permit holders can schedule and cancel inspections. The Building Division can create a new account for permit holders at the time of permit application or license registration. Alternatively, permits holders can create an account and link to Bloomfield Township records at www.accessmygov.com with a unique PIN number the Township can provide.
